

Definition of an Ordinary Member



Persons entitled to attend and vote at general meetings and elections of the Club are referred to as 'Ordinary members' under the Club's Memorandum and Articles of Association.

For the purposes of the Club's Memorandum and Articles of Association, an Ordinary Member is a person who, at the date being 10 business days before the date of a general meeting (if voting is to occur at the meeting) or at the date being 10 business days before the date polling opens (if voting is to occur by ballot), is:

- (a) at least 18 years of age; and
- (b) any one of:
 - (i) a Life Member;
 - (ii) a person holding a membership issued by the Club:
 - (A) designated as a Legends membership; or
 - (B) which entitles the person to access all home games of the Club's AFLM, AFLW or Netball teams; or
 - (iii) a person holding a Collingwood Social Club add-on to any Club, AFL Club Support or MCC Club Insider membership.

Where a general meeting or ballot is to be held on a date after the end of the most recently completed season of the relevant team, but before the start of the following season of such team, a person will be treated as an Ordinary Member if the person held the relevant membership for the season preceding or following that date.

For the avoidance of doubt, Ordinary Members do not include such persons holding the following categories of membership unless they have purchased a Social Club add-on to any Club, AFL or MCC membership:

- (a) AFL Club Support and MCC Club Insider – Memberships of the AFL or MCC where the Club may be selected as the person's preferred Club; or
- (b) Reduced-Access or Non-Access Members – Unless designated as a Legends membership, any and all categories of membership that do not grant the person access to all home games of the Club's AFLM, AFLW or Netball teams.
